

**BOARD OF CEMETERY COMMISSIONERS
COUNCIL ROOM, CITY HALL
106 W. DIVISION STREET
THURSDAY, JANUARY 22, 2026

The Board of Cemetery Commissioners met in City Hall, Chair Clough presiding. On roll call: Council Members Daniel Clough and Rolly Gelhaus and City Clerk-Treasurer Rex R. Roehl present. Mandy Krejci and Lori Pekol absent.

Also present: Cemetery Sexton Regan Barth.

The minutes of the previous meeting were declared approved.

Sexton Barth reported on normal maintenance of Cemetery grounds – snow removal, fewer burials so far this winter, when weather permits – removal of dead ash trees.

Chair Clough stated that the Common Council has borrowed money to begin the Columbarium project.

Sexton Barth stated that the City owns unplatted land on the East end of the Cemetery, it is nice and flat along the road, but drops off into a ravine on the far East end. In the center section there is a flagpole and bench.

The Commission reviewed State Statue §157.07 Platting for Cemeteries. TruMark Land Surveying, Jeanette Harley, is a local surveyor and has recently done a plat by Sherwood.

Discussion followed on platting a single section or multiple sections, extending between future roadways, placing the columbarium plot in a center section, granite companies, drawing site plan options and columbarium sizes, frost walls and footings for the columbarium.

Motion Gelhaus, second Clough to proceed with the Columbarium project and direct Cemetery Sexton Barth to get costs for platting and options and prices for site plans and columbariums. All Aye.

Motion Gelhaus, second Clough, to adjourn. All Aye.
